Phase IV, Programme No. - 05 05 Days Online National Workshop on Educational Philosophy and Psychology in Sanskrit Vangmay

From 20th to 24th July, 2020

Brief Report

The Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University (Central University), New Delhi established under the scheme of Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (MHRD), Govt. of India organized 05 Days Online National Workshop (5th programme of its IVth phase) on Educational Philosophy and Psychology in Sanskrit Vangmay from 20th to 24th July, 2020. The objectives of this workshop were to identify & analyse the basic concepts of Educational Philosophy & Psychology in Sanskrit Vangmay and to develop insight in knowledge integration from modern and Indian perspectives and its meaningful application in designing teaching learning systems & relevance for pedagogy, assessment, research, educational thoughts and so on. The online workshop was conducted through Google Meet platform. The inaugural session commenced with the welcome speech and backdrop note about the workshop by the Project Head Prof. Amita Pandey Bhardwaj followed by Chief guest address by Vice Chancellor, National Sanskrit University, Tirupati Prof. V. Muralidhara Sharma and Presidential address of hon'ble Vice Chancellor of our University **Prof. Ramesh Kumar Pandey** and ended up with vote of thanks by Prof. K. Bharathbooshan (Dean & Head, Faculty of Education). The workshop was transacted through 25 distinctly designed sessions comprising of Inaugural, Induction, 14 Technical and Q&A sessions, 05 Self-reflection, Online assessment, Feedback, Sharing of experiences and Valedictory session. The registration received till last date were 481 out of which 352 participants were screened and given confirmation in phase manner. Although, 266 participants confirmed their participation but only 209 continued & 57 left due to their personal reasons. In **209 participants**, 162 were from **22 states** and 47 from 3 UTs of India. The participants from 22 states include Andhra Pradesh (14), Assam (04), Bihar (09), Chhattisgarh (01), Goa (02), Gujarat (01), Haryana (15), Himachal Pradesh (04), Jharkhand (02), Karnataka (06), Kerala (02), Madhya Pradesh (06), Maharashtra (26), Odisha (04), Punjab (03), Rajasthan (14), Tamil Nadu (17), Telangana (04), Tripura (03), Uttarakhand (03), Uttar Pradesh (17) & West Bengal (05) while that of three UTs were J&K (01), Chandigarh (01) and Delhi (45). All the technical sessions were conducted under the able guidance of ten Resource Persons having expertise in the concerned area from various reputed institutions. The main themes covered in the workshop were – Foundations of Educational Philosophy & Psychology in Sanskrit Vangmaya, Epistemology, Cognition & their Pedagogical Implications, Emotional intelligence, Spiritual intelligence, Stress management & Value based education in Indian perspective, Personality & Projection, Vedic education system, Ancient education system, Nyay & Budhh darshan – their educational relevance. The participants were given **12** assignments on the basis of the themes taken up in the technical sessions. An online assessment test was administered where 45% of the participants scored above 60%. In order to ensure the quality of the lectures delivered from the participant's point of view an online feedback about the Resource Persons was taken in 04 categories viz. Outstanding, Very good, Good & Satisfactory and the average found was 77%, 19%, 03% & 01% in the respective categories. In addition to this, online feedback about the workshop was also taken on 10 points in five categories and the average percentage was found to be 75% in Excellent, 21% in Very good, 04% in Good and Nil in Satisfactory and Unsatisfactory categories. In the valedictory session, the Project Head welcomed the guests and presented the workshop report followed by the Chief guest address by Shri Atul Kothari (National Secretary, Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas, New Delhi) and presidential address by our hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. Ramesh Kumar Pandey. The workshop ended with vote of thanks. After completion of the workshop, the e-certificates and e-photo album were mailed to the successful participants.
