Some of the Modern Subjects i.e. Hindi, English, Sociology, Environment Science and Political Science have also been incorporated in the undergraduate course. The students of UG and PG have also been provided knowledge of Computers and their operation. Apart from the above, the students enrolled in M.Phil and Ph.D. programme have been provided a 6 month course on Research methodology and manuscriptology etc.

With the approval of the academic council and UGC, the Vidyapeetha has started a new UG course i.e. B.A (Yoga) with the capacity of enrolment of fifty students in a year and PG course i.e. M.A (Yoga) from the academic session 2018-19 with the initial intake capacity of hundred students in a year which now has been reduced fifty students per year.

The Department of Education, Faculty of Shiksha Shastra is also an important unit of the Vidyapeetha. At present, this faculty consists of members from both traditional and modern teachers-training areas of knowledge. This faculty conducts courses for higher studies i.e. Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.), Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.), Vishistacharya (M.Phil) and Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.). Students have been admitted in B.Ed., M.Ed. and Ph.D. courses based on All India Entrance Test conducted by Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Rashtriya Sanskirt Vidyapeetha, New Delhi. The students of **Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.)** are trained for teaching in Sanskrit language and traditional subjects like Sahitya, Darshan and Jyotish etc. with modern subjects at school level. Students of Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) are also taught Computer subject. **Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.)** Course is a teacher educator's course where students are prepared to teach teachers at different levels. The dissertation work of Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.) are specially based on different aspects of education in Indian ancient perspective and modern perspective such as problems of educational administration, current policies on education, special education, philosophical, psychological and sociological aspects of education, innovative teaching and analysis of Indian literature from the point of teaching and learning. **Vishishta Acharya (M.Phil**) is also an important course of this department which prepares students for Ph.D/ Research work. **Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.)** students do their research work on different areas of traditional and modern education.

Computerization of Administration:-

All the Sections, Department and Faculties have been provided computer facilities with network & printers by the Vidyapeetha. All the information (i.e. Application Forms, Bye laws, Course, Alumni etc.) related to Vidyapeetha are available on the website. Steps are being taken to implement the UMS software for computerization of all the activities of the Vidyapeetha.

Computerization of Library: -

The Vidyapeetha Library namely as MahaMahopadhyaya Dr. Mandan Mishra Granthalaya (University Central Library) has been computerized. A Propriety Library software has also been installed in the Library and its various modules have been functional and being utilized. The library has started e-services (Internet Facility) on 11th March, 2014 under which ten computers with internet connectivity have been installed to access UGC Infonet and other online resources by the students, faculty members and others. This service has been very popular amongst readers as it provides a platform to access a wide variety of online resources as well as it enlightens about other online services. The library has been open to readers for reading and reference service on every Saturday from 14th February, 2014. The environment of the campus is very conducive for learning and research. Close interaction with readers 'community is an integral programme of the Library. Wi-fi facilities, CCTV are also installed in the library. Efforts are on to enrich and development of Vidyapeetha Website, where a separate link to the library will be facilitated. All information and services related to the library would be made available under this link. Vidyapeetha library has been the first Sanskrit library which has got all its physical copies of theses and dissertations digitalized and almost 450 theses have been made available on the Shodhganga portal. Efforts are on to develop an Institutional Repository in the Vidyapeetha which would host all the in house publications including articles, theses, dissertations, etc.

6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

Vision The Vidyapeetha has been established to preserve the Shastric Tradition and to undertake interpretation of Shastras apart from establishing their relevance to the problems in the modern context.

Mission

Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, New Delhi has been established to impart instruction in traditional Sanskrit lore with special attention to highly specialized branches. Apart from higher studies in Sanskrit Literature, the Vidyapeetha is also committed to Literature, Emphasis has been on Vedic Sanskrit i.e., classical Sanskrit and study in contemporary literature in Sanskrit, Various new components have to be taken for providing specialized means for training of Sanskrit teachers and research in pedagogical aspects of Sanskrit education.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

The Vidyapeetha has established computer Centre to manage ICT. The Computer Centre monitors the information

system & provides required information. However, the Vidyapeetha is in the process to adopt the UMS in near future.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The Curriculum structure of all the courses framed by the Vidyapeetha based on the recommendations of the Board of studies in terms of CBCS system of UGC is implemented in Vidyapeetha for UG/PG and research level courses. All the courses/subjects were also codified for making the identification simple and proper

The Vidyapeetha imparting the education to its students as per the approved Academic Calendar and the teachers and students ratio is maintained as per UGC guidelines.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The Examinations of all the students is conducted as per Academic Calendar after end-term/mid-term semester system following the provisions given in the Bye Laws. The internal evaluation is made by the faculty based on the laid down criteria. The evaluation of the answer sheet/project report is also made as per laid down provisions by the Vidyapeetha.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The Vidyapeetha is providing research facilities in 20 disciplines. The research programmes/courses are develop and monitored as per the guideline of UGC. The performance of the research scholars are reviewed by the departmental research review committee twice in year and all research activities are monitored by the research board of the Vidyapeetha.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The Vidyapeetha has established a central library wherein more than 1,00,000 books, 200 journals and 4,500 books are available in books bank. The library has already uploaded around 450 Ph.D. theses on ShodhGanga. There is a publication unit in the Vidyapeetha which publish the journal and Books of the Vidyapeetha. There are more than 50,000 books available for sale in the publication unit.

The Vidyapeetha has established two computer lab for the student of Shastraic tradition and one computer lab for the student of B.Ed. and M. Ed. Apart from computerisation of all the sections, the Deans of the Faculties/HODs have also been provided computer with ICT facilities. Wi-Fi has also been provided in library, hostel, guest house and common rooms of the students. Swarna Jayanti Sadan, Brihaspati Bhawan, Saraswati Sadhna Sadan, Shaikshranic Sadan, Vishranti Nilayah and Boys Hostel have been providing basic infrastructure facilities for learning & teaching.

Availability of water and electricity are ensured by the Engineering Section of the Vidyapeetha with the help of 3 tube wells and 3 Diesel Generators sets. The 99.99% of the waste water is recycling and used for horticulture, greenery etc. by the University.

Entire rain water of the Vidyapeetha complex is recharged into the Ground Water through 13 bores at five different locations in the campus. Rain water on roof top of all buildings of the Vidyapeetha is also conserved by roof top harvesting.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The Vidyapeetha has been sectioned 139 teaching post and 136 non-teaching post. There are 5 faculties supported by Deans and 21 HODs to manage the affairs of the departments. The administration of the Vidyapeetha is maintained by Registrar with the support of Deputy Registrar, Assistant Registrars and Section Officers in accordance with the provisions made in the MOA & Bye-Laws of the Vidyapeetha.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The appointment of teaching post is made as per provision given by the UGC Regulations on Minimums Qualifications for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in Universities and Colleges and measures for the maintenance of standards in Higher Education 2010 as amended from time to time.

The appointment of non-teaching post is made as per the provision given in the Bye Laws governing the method of recruitments of non-teaching staff of the Vidyapeetha.

As the Vidyapeetha has been established for the preservation and propagation of the shastraic tradition of teaching and learning, there is very limited scope for interaction with modern industries. However, the department of Vastu Shastra, Jyotish paurohitya etc. extend valuable suggestion to the industrialist as and when approached by them. So far as, collaboration with industries is concerned, there is very limited scope in the institution.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

The Vidyapeetha carries out publicity for admission in various newspapers including employment news as well as through the website of the Vidyapeetha. The admission of students of Shastri, Acharya, B.A. (Yog), M.A.(Yog) BEd, MEd, M.Phil and PhD courses of this Vidyapeetha is made based on All India Entrance Test conducted by the Vidyapeetha.

ORDER

WHEREAS, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-section (2) of Section 32 of the National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993 (73 of 1993) and in supersession of the National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2009, the National Council for Teacher Education has notified the Regulations, 2014 on 01.12.2014.

AND WHEREAS, the institution Shri Lal Bahadur Shashrti Raashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth, 2. Katwaria Sarai, New Delhi was recognized by NRC vide its Order No. NRC/NCTE/F-3/DL-65/1998/4311-13 dated 18.11.1998 for B.Ed. course for 180 seats.

3. AND WHEREAS, the institution Shri Lal Bahadur Shashrti Raashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth, Katwaria Sarai, New Delhi has by affidavit consented to come under New Regulations and sought for two basic units in B.Ed. which require additional facilities.

AND WHEREAS, it has been decided to permit the institution to have two basic units of 50 students 4. each subject to the institution fulfilling following conditions namely.

- The institution shall create additional facilities that include (a) additional built-up-area, (b) additional (i) infrastructure, (c) additional funds, (d) adhere to staff norms as per Regulations, 2014 and inform Regional Committees with required documents by October 31, 2015.
- The application-Institution for additional unit will be required to submit the required documents such as (ii) land documents, Encumbrance Certificate (EC), Land Use Certificate (LUC) and the Building Plan (BP) in the specified proforma available on the website to the Regional Committee in proof of having provided additional facilities before October 31, 2015. Building completion Certificate (BCC) may be given along with other documents if available, otherwise it can also be given to the Visiting Team at the time of inspection.
- (iiii) The Regional Committees shall arrange for verification of documents, inspection of these premises and check adherence to these condition by 20 February, 2016. If it is found by the Regional Committee that the institution fails to comply with these requirements, the institutions shall not be permitted to admit students for the academic year 2016-2017.
- (iv) In case any existing institution's matter is sub-judice under court direction/SCN under section 17 of the NCTE Act/ Complaint etc., the institution shall be required to submit a copy of the Hon'ble Court order/reply to SCN/complaint/already submitted alongwith the documents, if any together the documents referred above. In case the institution's request for shifting of premises is pending, such institution shall be required to submit the requisite documents as per provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 with a copy of the order/NOC of the affiliating body/State Govt. and such other documents as indicated in the revised format recognition order. The final decision shall be subject to the directions given by the Hon'ble Court in the Writ Petition/case decided by the Northern Regional Committee in respect of Section 17/complaint cases etc.

Now therefore, in the light of the above, the Northern Regional Committee, NCTE hereby issues the 5. revised Recognition Order to Shri Lal Bahadur Shashrti Raashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth, Katwaria Sarai, New Delhi for conducting B.Ed. programme of two years duration with an annual intake of 100 for two basic units of 50 students each from the academic session 2015-2016 subject to fulfillment of the conditions mentioned herein before 31.10.2015.

- (e) Fee charged from students.
- (f) Available infrastructural facilities.
- (g) Facilities added during the last quarter.
- (h) Number of books in the library, journals subscribed to and additions, if any, in the last quarter.
- (i) The affidavit with enclosure submitted along with application.
- (j) The institution shall be free to post additional relevant information, if is so desires.
- (k) Any false or incomplete information on website shall render the institution liable for withdrawal of recognition.
